

## PROTOCOL FOR STUDENTS DURING NIGHT DUTIES AT CLINICS OF THE VETERINARY FACULTY UNIVERSITY OF ZAGREB

- ⇒ Students of the 4th and 6th year of studies of Integrated undergraduate and graduate university study programme within the curriculum program must participate in one (4th year) or two (6th year) night duties according to the previously determined schedule (swapping and replacements are not allowed; upon the end of semester compensation will be allowed for students that justify their absence).
- $\Rightarrow$  On the day of the duty, to record their presence, students should personally get in contact with the doctor on duty (for that night) at 16:00.
- $\Rightarrow$  During the night duty students are obligated to wear personal protective clothes and carry students' ID tags.
- ⇒ The room in which students are allowed to reside (in accordance with the doctor on duty) is situated in the clinical yard between the room for interns and the backup room for patients' admission during the night. The key to this room students take from the doctor in charge and upon the end of their duty, they should return it to the same clinic.
- ⇒ Within the room for students there are lockers with keys that may be used for holding personal belongings. Upon the end of the duty, the lockers should be left clean, empty, and with a key in the lock. In the same manner, upon the end of the duty, the students should leave the room clean and tidy.
- ⇒ During the duty the doctor in charge assigns students tasks (and forms that should be filled) regarding newly admitted or hospitalized patients at clinic which is on duty during that night or (according to the needs) at other clinics which is decided by the doctor in charge.
- ⇒ The duty ends at 8:00 the next day. Students may choose not to attend the curriculum of that (following) day (the absence from the curriculum of that day will be justified).
