**STUDENT OBLIGATIONS**

Seminars attendance	Student is obliged to attend at least 7 out of 10 hourly classes to achieve minimum number of points (7 points out of 12; coefficient =1,2)
Practicals attendance	Student is obliged to attend 3 out of 5 hourly classes to achieve minimum number of points (4 points out of 6; coefficient =1,2)
