

PROTOCOL FOR STUDENTS DURING CLINICAL NIGHT DUTIES AT THE FACULTY OF VETERINARY MEDICINE UNIVERSITY OF ZAGREB

- ⇒ Students of the 6th year of studies of Integrated under-graduate and graduate course in veterinary medicine within the curriculum program have to participate in four night duties according to the previously determined schedule (swapping and replacements are not allowed; upon the end of semester compensation will be allowed for students that justify their absence)
- ⇒ To record their presence, students should contact the doctor in duty (for that night) at 7 p.m.
- ⇒ Students are obligated to wear personal protective clothes and carry students ID tags.
- ⇒ The room in which students can reside (in accordance with the doctor in charge) is situated in the clinical yard between the room for interns and the spare room for the night admissions. The key to this room and the adjoining bathroom (exclusively for students) students should take from doctor in charge, and upon the end of their duty they should return it to the same clinic.
- ⇒ Within the student room, there are fold-out beds and armchairs, a tea kitchen, and lockers with keys which may be used for holding personal belongings. Upon the end of the duty the students should leave the room clean and tidy, with clean, empty lockers with a key in the lock.
- ⇒ During the duty the doctor in charge assigns tasks (and forms that should be filled) to each student regarding newly admitted or hospitalized patients at the clinic which is on duty or (as required) at other clinics which is decided by the doctor in charge.
- ⇒ The duty ends on 8 a.m. the next day. Students may choose not to attend curriculum on day after night duty (the absence from the curriculum will be justified).
- ⇒ Students who are mothers of children up to six years of age, single parent students, and fathers on parental leave can replace night classes with daytime clinical work.
- ⇒ Considering the current large number of existing volunteer agreements with students, upon the student's request, the possibility of recognizing the undertaken responsibilities of the volunteer position during the night at clinics over the past year as an equivalent to the night classes prescribed by the curriculum of the Professional-Clinical Work course will be considered.
